

What is the energy goal for American Samoa?

In 2016, the American Samoa Renewable Energy Committee set a goal to meet 50% of American Samoa's energy from renewable energy resources by 2025 and 100% by 2040, primarily with solar energy. In 2021, per capita electricity consumption in American Samoa was about 70% less than the U.S. average.

Will Tesla Solar power Ta'u in American Samoa?

Tesla has announced their solar panels are nearly entirely powering the island of Ta'u in American Samoa. The island used to depend entirely on imported diesel fuel for its electricity, but a new initiative has seen the islanders build a 1.4-megawatt microgrid that absorbs and stores solar power for all their energy needs.

How many people live in Samoa?

(The island's population varies with the season but usually falls between 200 and 600 people.) The solar project was installed by SolarCity, a California-based company recently purchased by Elon Musk's Tesla. The \$8 million project was funded by the U.S. Department of Interior and the American Samoa Power Authority (ASPA).

What is American Samoa known for?

The islands also experience occasional devastating tropical cyclones. 18,19 In 2021, American Samoa's gross domestic product (GDP) on a per capita basis was about 22% that of the United States. 20 The territory's largest private sector industry is tuna fishing and processing, and canned tuna is American Samoa's main export.

The stability and affordability of power from the new Ta'u microgrid, operated by American Samoa Power Authority, provides energy independence for the nearly 600 residents of Ta'u. The battery system also allows the island to use stored solar energy at night, meaning renewable energy is available for use around the clock.

The system, operated by American Samoa Power Authority, comprises 5,000 SolarCity solar panels and 60 Tesla Powerpack battery-storage systems. It has 6 megawatt-hours of battery storage and can fully recharge in seven hours of sunlight. SolarCity implemented the microgrid in one year, according to the company blog. ...

American Samoa's largest renewable energy facility is a 1.75-MW ground-mounted PV grid-connected system that is expected to replace over 175,000 gallons of ASPA diesel fuel consumption. In addition, American Samoa possesses more than 700-kW of roof-mounted PV on government and private

The American Samoa government received \$720,000 to scale-up existing weatherization efforts on the islands, create jobs, reduce carbon emissions and save money for American Samoa's low-income families. Over the course of the Recovery Act, American Samoa's goal is to weatherize approximately

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The island of Ta'u in the U.S. territory of American Samoa relied heavily on diesel generation to meet its electricity needs until a solar+storage microgrid was installed in 2016. Now, instead of burning through 300 gallons of imported diesel fuel every day, the island's homes and businesses are almost entirely powered by solar+storage.
