

How to see auroras in Finland?

Find a dark, open place preferably far away from town lights. As auroras are most often seen on the northern sky, try to find an unrestricted view at least toward the northern horizon. Optimal weather for watching auroras, dark and cloudless night, is practically always cold in Finland. Dress very warmly.

Can you see aurora borealis in Lapland?

It has to be dark enough, making Lapland an ideal place to see the amazing dancing lights in the sky. Aurora Borealis, commonly known as the Northern Lights, are visible between September and mid-April. Because of our location at Aurora Village, there is a great chance for you to see the magic happen during the Aurora season from our own yard.

How common are auroras in Lapland?

In Lapland auroras are quite common always, even during solar minimum. ISES RWC Finland provides real-time information on the level of geomagnetic disturbances in Finland. Geomagnetic activity is closely linked with auroras: when the activity level exceeds a location-specific threshold, it is probable to see auroras (weather permitting).

When are the aurora lights visible in Lapland?

Auroras are visible between September and mid-April, whenever it gets dark enough. During the summer in Lapland, the Northern Lights are not visible due to the midnight sun. During the Aurora season, we can see the dancing lights statistically for 5 out of 7 nights, if the sky is clear, at our area in Ivalo, Lapland.

Where is the best place to see aurora borealis?

The northernmost part of the country--Lapland--is the best destination for aurora borealis chasers. It can be reached by train or plane from the capital of Helsinki. You can go on a northern lights snowmobile adventure, try dog-sledding, snowshoeing, or just watch the northern lights with comfort at a glass igloo.

Finland is on the southern rim of the auroral oval. The probability for seeing auroras is best in the northernmost part of the country, i.e. in Lapland. During geomagnetic storms the auroral oval expands southward and then auroras are seen also in Central and Southern Finland.
