

How many solar PV projects are being built in Azerbaijan?

UAE state-owned renewable energy developer Masdar has started constructing two solar PV projects in Azerbaijan, with a combined capacity of 760MW. The entire development, developed in collaboration with Azerbaijan's state oil company SOCAR, includes the 445MW Bilasuvar solar PV project, the 315MW Neftchala solar PV project and a 240MW wind project.

How much electricity will Azerbaijan generate a year?

PV Tech reported that these projects are the first phase of a 10GW pipeline of renewables projects in Azerbaijan signed in 2022. Parviz Shahbazov, Azerbaijan's energy minister, said the projects could generate 2.3 billion kWh of electricity annually.

Will Azerbaijan generate 30% of its energy capacity by 2030?

Azerbaijan plans to generate 30% of its energy capacity from renewable power by 2030. Last month, Azerbaijan announced its first solar auction, seeking private support for the design, financing, operation and maintenance of a 100MW project in the eastern municipality of Gobustan.

How much power does Azerbaijan's 308MWp project produce?

Accordingly, the 308MWp project covers an area of about 5.5 million square meters in the Gobustan District, about 60 kilometers southwest of Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan. It will produce 500 million kilowatt-hours of power annually once operational.

As it continues to develop the energy sector, AIIB is contributing to the green transition in Azerbaijan. In addition to the recent agreements signed at COP29, the bank plans to finance the construction of additional solar and wind power generation facilities in the country.

At COP29 in Baku, the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) revealed a significant investment in Azerbaijan's renewable energy future. Teaming up with the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), the EBRD will help fund two major solar power projects.

The project entailed developing, financing, constructing, and operating the 230MWac PV plant, located nine kilometers northwest of the Alat settlement in the Republic of Azerbaijan. The plant is started commercial operation in October 2023.

The Bilasuvar Solar is located in the Bilasuvar district of the Shirvan-Salyan region in Azerbaijan, about 140 km south of Baku. The Project site covers one land plot of approximately 1,454 hectares, categorized as agricultural land and owned by the Bilasuvar Executive Power.
