

Where is the Presidency building located in Bosnia and Herzegovina?

The Presidency Building (or the Building of the Presidency; Serbo-Croatian: Zgrada Predsjedništva /?????? ??????????????) is the official residence of the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina, located in the Centar Municipality of Sarajevo, in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

What is the main residence of Bosnia & Herzegovina?

Since 1996, the building has been used as the official residence of the collective Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina. All of the collective heads of state use the building as their main residence in Sarajevo, as well as their ceremonial and working office.

What is the tallest building in Bosnia & Herzegovina?

The tallest building in Bosnia and Herzegovina is currently the Avaz Twist Tower in Sarajevo. It is 466 feet (142 m) tall and it was completed by 2008. One of the most popular skyscrapers in Sarajevo are the UNITIC World Trade Towers, they were renovated after the war in the 1990s, but originally were completed in 1981.

How was the interior space organized in Bosnia and Herzegovina?

Interior space was organized around the hearth in a central room with separate private quarters for men and women. Even though military fortresses in Bosnia and Herzegovina date from the era of Roman rule, most of them were built between the 12th and 15th century.

Who built the National Bank of Bosnia & Herzegovina?

Other works: The Damic House at 10 Radiceva Street in Sarajevo was built according to a 1926 project by Helen Baldasar and Dusan Smiljanic. The building of the National Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina was built in 1932 according to the project of the Belgrade architect Milan Zlokovic.
