

Where is Bouvet Island?

Bouvet Island (/ˈbuːveɪ /BOO-vay; Norwegian: Bouvetøya [buˈvøːɐ̯]) is an uninhabited island and dependency of Norway. It is a protected nature reserve. It is a subantarctic volcanic island, situated in the South Atlantic Ocean at the southern end of the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, and is the world's most remote island.

What country code is Bouvet Island?

Bouvet Island has been designated with the ISO 3166-2 code BV and was subsequently awarded the country code top-level domain .bv on 21 August 1997. The domain is managed by Norid but is not in use. The exclusive economic zone surrounding the island covers an area of 441,163 km<sup>2</sup> (170,334 sq mi).

How did Bouvet Island work?

During the activation of Bouvet Island, the team contacted over 7,000 other radio operators using multiple methods across some of the HF radio bands, including CW, SSB, and FT8. The team operated using multiple antenna systems during the activation, including vertical arrays.

How did Bouvet Island get its name?

At that point, the island was given its current name of Bouvet Island ("Bouvetøya" in Norwegian). In 1930, following resolution of a dispute with the United Kingdom over claiming rights, it was declared a Norwegian dependency. In 1971, it was designated a nature reserve.

How did Bouvet Island become a dependency?

The expedition carried out aerial photography of the island and was the first Antarctic expedition to use aircraft. : 64 The Dependency Act, passed by the Parliament of Norway on 27 February 1930, established Bouvet Island as a Norwegian dependency, along with Peter I Island and Queen Maud Land.
