On February 23, 2016, the Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta (the "Court") granted an Order (the "Receivership Order") whereby Alvarez & Marsal Canada Inc. ("A&M") was appointed receiver and manager (the "Receiver") of Brevia Energy Inc. (referred to as "Brevia" or the "Company").

As of 2020, more than 90% of electrical generation in Haiti was derived from fossil fuels and less than 10% from renewables.

As of 2020, Haiti has tax reductions and exemptions in place for renewable energy projects. Solar microgrids are a top priority for those interested in enhancing clean energy potential in Haiti, with more than 20 planned between 2020 and 2024 to replace diesel generators.
