Is formaldehyde-free furniture really a thing?

So completely formaldehyde-free furniture isn't really a thing...However, this is mostly a matter of semantics because what you should really be looking for is furniture that is LOW in formaldehyde and does not have added formaldehyde from things like glues and resins.

How can I reduce the risk of formaldehyde in my home?

There are ways to reduce the risk of exposure to formaldehyde, such as avoiding newly manufactured furniture made from particle board and looking for products with zero-VOC finishes. To avoid bringing any toxic chemicals into your home, look for organic and non-toxic products that are free of synthetic chemicals.

Does laminate furniture have formaldehyde?

Laminate essentially consists of synthetic materials that are made to look like wood. It can be quite difficult to find out exactly what is actually in laminate furniture, but it often contains things like formaldehyde (and other VOCs) as well as phthalates. Does All Furniture Have Formaldehyde?

Are there formaldehyde-free cabinets?

The move towards CARB II and GreenGuard Gold has greatly improved the formaldehyde levels in the conventional options in recent years. Regular plywood-based cabinets (as opposed to particleboard or MDF) offgas quite rapidly, while at the same time, more companies are offering formaldehyde-free options.

Where is formaldehyde found in furniture?

When formaldehyde is in our environment at higher concentrations, that's when it can start causing problems, from skin irritation to cancer. The place where you'll usually find the most formaldehyde in furniture is in engineered wood, which include MDF (medium-density fiberboard), plywood, or particleboard.

Where can I find information on formaldehyde & consumer products?

Sources of formaldehyde in the home include building materials, smoking, household products, and the use of un-vented, fuel-burning appliances, like gas stoves or kerosene space heaters.
