What are the risks associated with solar PV systems?

When dealing with solar PV systems, shock or electrocution from energized wires is a severe risk. The possibility of electric shock and burns is one of the most critical risks associated with solar PV systems. This could happen if the system has to be properly grounded or if the wiring or equipment has flaws.

How do I protect my solar panels from electrical surges?

"Grounding" means connecting your solar electric systems to the earth so that excess and dangerous electrical currents can be diverted from your home and appliances and dispersed into the ground.

Finally, external influences also make up a portion of solar panel fires. External influences that can cause solar panel fires include moisture and water ingress into parts of the PV system, such as the DC and AC connectors.
