How is French Guiana governed?

In 1946, French Guiana was officially declared an overseas department of France. Accordingly, the chief of state is the French president, who operates through a prefect appointed by officials in Paris. Local administration is handled through a 19-member general council and a 31-member regional council.

What is the history of French Guiana?
