Protecting yourself from solar scams means taking a proactive approach and following a few key strategies. One of the most effective ways to protect yourself from solar scams is to know the average cost of solar panels in your area. By researching prices, you can identify quotes that are suspiciously high or low.

What are the most common solar scams?

One of the most prevalent solar scams involves misleading lease agreements or power purchase agreements (PPAs). While these financing options are legitimate ways to access solar energy, unethical companies may misrepresent the terms or benefits of these agreements.

How do I know if a solar contract is a scam?

Pay attention to warranties, cancellation policies, payment schedules, and try to spot any hidden fees. Honest businesses will give you time to go over the terms of the contract, understand the agreement, and let you sign it in writing. To learn more, visit [ftc.gov/solar](https://www.ftc.gov/solar). Are solar business leads a scam?
