Are solar customers victims of fraud & forgery?

Across the country, prosecutors are investigating high-pressure sales tactics and misleading financing arrangements. Some customers say they were victims of fraud and forgery. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau recently warned solar customers about hidden fees and deceptive statements about the financial benefits of solar.

How do I know if a solar contract is a scam?

Pay attention to warranties, cancellation policies, payment schedules, and try to spot any hidden fees. Honest businesses will give you time to go over the terms of the contract, understand the agreement, and let you sign it in writing. To learn more, visit ftc.gov/solar. And if you spot a scam, tell the FTC.

Are solar business leads a scam?

At best, this is someone generating leads to sell, not actual solar businesses. At worst, they're scammerstrying to steal your identity. If you spot a scam, tell the Federal Trade Commission at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.

What if my company offers solar energy?

If your company offers solar energy, remember that claims must not only be truthful, but also comply with established consumer protection laws, including the FTC Act and the FTC's new Impersonation Rule. Be truthful. Every clean energy company has a responsibility to be honest and upfront with consumers. Be transparent about what you're offering.
