

The Kosovo Ministry of Economy opens a 40% subsidy fund for household solar thermal systems until August 31. The second phase follows on October 31, aiming to support renewable energy investments in line with their goal to source 35% of electricity from renewables by 2031 through an upcoming auction and other initiatives.

Firms that build photovoltaic systems of 10 kW and more are entitled to as much as EUR 6,000 per beneficiary

The pace of development for solar projects in Kosovo is increasing. There is growing interest from investors to engage in developing new solar capacities across the country. Currently there are roughly 10 MW generated through small-scale solar energy projects.
