What are monocrystalline solar panels?

Monocrystalline solar panels, often called 'Mono,' are solar panels created from a single crystal structure. This design allows electrons, which are powered by sunlight, to move freely and generate a high flow of electricity, resulting in their high efficiency and sleek, aesthetic design.

What are polycrystalline solar panels?

Polycrystalline solar panels (or poly panels) are made of individual polycrystalline solar cells. Just like monocrystalline solar cells, polycrystalline solar cells are made from silicon crystals. The difference is that, instead of being extruded as a single pure ingot, the silicon crystal cools and fragments on its own.

How much does it cost to install monocrystalline panels?

The labor costs to install monocrystalline panels are similar to installing other types. They typically cost between \$0.50 and \$1.20 per watt to install, which translates to an average panel cost of between \$125 to \$480 in labor. For a 10-panel installation, labor costs would be roughly \$1,250 to \$4,800.

How long do monocrystalline solar panels last?

Monocrystalline solar panels have a useful life that can extend to well over 30 years. They often come with a 25-year warranty, and the panels' longevity can offset the slightly higher upfront cost with decades of free electricity generation. Be cautious of seemingly cheap solar panels.
