

Should Zimbabwe invest in solar power?

Interest in investing in Zimbabwe's solar power market is on the rise as the Ministry approves 39 solar PV projects for development. The Zimbabwe Energy Regulatory Authority (Zera) has processed 39 solar power projects that have capacity to generate up 1,151.87MW, as the country moves towards renewable energy to increase capacity.

How many solar power projects are there in Zimbabwe?

As of 31 July 2019, the Zimbabwe Energy Regulatory Authority (ZERA) had issued more than 77 power generation licences with 42 being solar power projects. A number of IPPs are already selling electricity to the Zimbabwe Electricity Transmission and Distribution Company (ZETDC) and feeding into the national grid.
